





The symposium has passed, but be sure to send a club representative to the regular Federation Annual General Meeting at PIPEX.

The Federation needs 2 Canadian Directors – one to fill in a one-year commitment and the second to do a standard two-year commitment.

The first page of this journal is typically reserved for a Pacific Northwest/Canada (Federation Territory) postal history article. Since I do not study this area, I need <u>everyone who specializes</u> in this material to submit philatelic stories, photos, scans of philatelic material, etc. This is necessary unless you want to see articles on my specialties of India, Peafowl and Siamese Cats.

I also need all clubs to update their dues structures and fees, meeting times and days, etc., on 12-14.

Journal material submission deadlines and 4 issues per year publication schedule are on Page 9.

I am revitalizing the **Upcoming Stamp Shows/Bourses** list (page 15). Please send me your club show information for the year so I can get the list updated. When you are itching to attend a stamp show, be sure to check this list, generally on the last page of each issue.

We have work to do. The Northwest Federation of Stamp Clubs has stumbled, and we have work to do to get it back up.

Why? Why do we have a Northwest Federation, especially in a huge area of five US states and four Canadian provinces, which at

that, are among the largest provinces and states? What can the Federation do?

As a goal, first, the Federation can promote philately. Of course. How? By an exchange of ideas, by encouraging each other and by engaging in our hobby as individuals, as members of local clubs and as local clubs helping each other.

Second, and this is somewhat included in the first, the Federation can facilitate social philately in its member organizations. We can work together.

Not letting distances restrict us, we can electronically present programs to each other. We can work together. Not letting our small, spread-out population restrict us, we can announce and support each other's shows and exhibits. We can work together. Not letting our diverse interests over-specialize us, we can share knowledge. We will work together.

How? Much of the success in achieving these two goals will be shown in our journal, *The Federated Philatelist*. This will succeed if many collectors (many, many collectors) submit articles. Articles to share our enthusiasm. Articles to exhibit our excitement. Articles to express our wonder in philately. And articles to teach what we know about our special corner of philately. This was a goal of Darin Cherniwchan, the previous editor.

We need participation from the little guys. The national journals have the big guys, and some from the Federation area are among the big guys. We want articles about which readers will think, "I'm glad I read that" or "Well, I can do that with my topic" or "I can use that with my collection". You, reader, do things with your stamp collecting that will get one of these responses.

Carol Edholm, who is the new editor, presented youth workshops for 18 years in as many as 24 shows throughout Washington, Oregon and California in one year. She was Chair for 3 years of SEAPEX, a WSP show in Seattle. She also coordinated the India Study Circle's participation in US WSP shows. Carol wants the Federated Philatelist to be a "show and tell" with submissions from all the nine areas and the 30-plus clubs in the Federation. Let's roll up our sleeves and help her.

We have work to do.

Thunderbird Award


The Northwest Federation provides a ribbon to be awarded to a worthy exhibit at all shows held within the geographic area of the Federation. The purpose of this award is to encourage exhibiting, whether or not the exhibitor is a member of a Federation organization.

Exhibits that receive a Vermeil or higher award are not eligible and the judges of the show have sole authority to award or not award the ribbon.

Member clubs that hold shows with competitive exhibits can request the Thunderbird ribbon from the Executive Secretary. Local and regional shows are authorized to present a single award and national shows may present two awards.

The 2024 John D. Arn Symposium

The *Thirty-Second John D. Arn Philatelic Symposium* was held at Moses Lake, Washington, on Saturday, April 6, 2024. Four invited speakers gave us their perspectives on stamps and related interests.

- Larry Crain spoke on the archeology and culture of Peru and its depiction on their stamps.
- George Struble told us about SCADTA, the early Colombian Airline that carried mail over the difficult terrain to ships that would take it to Europe.
- Roger Heath showed examples and reasons for refused mail in Switzerland.
- Mike Zak shared the highlights of his collection of interesting covers.
- In addition, other collectors were asked to give short notes on further topics:
 - o Jim Andre showed us examples of the re-entry varieties on early Newfoundland stamps.
 - Steve Brandt reminded us of the contributions of Booker T. Washington and the Tuskegee Institute.

There were both silent and live auctions that offered over 150 lots. The participants enjoyed a wonderful day of information and fellowship we have come to expect from the symposium.



Nominations for 2025 can be received until next January, but they will gladly be accepted at any of the Federation time slots at PIPEX 2024: Friday, May 3, 10:30 - 12:30pm or Saturday, May 4, 12:30 – 1:30 pm, or Sunday, May 5, 10:00 am to 12:00 pm.
